Officer Membership

- □ Both paid and promotional numbers have bounced back from 2013/14 low points, with promotional memberships gaining more ground over time.



















Chapter Excellence Award Program

The need for change ...

- We are up to 28 chapters now, but have only received 7-13 award submissions per year since 2009.
- □ Hampton Roads and San Diego have dominated large chapter submissions, Newport and Pearl Harbor have straddled large and small categories, and Annapolis and D.C. chapters have been shut out despite strong submissions.
- Many small chapters with less than 100 members have rarely/never submitted packages, although their SITREP chapter news submissions show plenty of activity.
- ☐ The Membership Committee believes now is the right time to add more rigor to the chapter excellence award process and motivate more chapters to submit packages

 - Facilitators included a former Lockheed Martin/Silicon Valley Corporate Strategic Recruiter who regularly mentors transitioning military members; approach different than TAPs, Ruehlin Courses
 - Group and individual instruction on web based job opportunity search, individual networking, and focused target company contact techniques using social media resources such as LINKEDIN.
- ☐ Class participants individually contacted 45 days after session for critique purposes
 - General feedback: Different approach takes person out of their (traditional military) comfort zone, pushes individuals to explore job opportunities outside of local area, and with companies other than traditional defense and aerospace industry players (10% of U.S. labor market).

Policy for Maintaining a Level of Financial Reserves


It is necessary for any organization to maintain some level of financial reserves to ensure smooth operations and provide some protection against unexpected reduction or cessation of expected revenues.

Since 1999, SNA has kept funds in excess of current operating needs in a combination of certificates of deposit and conservative market index mutual funds.

SNA has grown since 1999 albeit slowly and it provides a variety of programs for its members including chapter support, a robust set of awards, and an active scholarship program. Additionally, the organization supports a variety of one-time projects on a case-by-case basis in most years. Reserves provide a safety net for uninterrupted provision of these programs.

For the past several years, SNA revenues have been about five hundred thousand dollars per year (\$500,000.) It is common practice among not-for- profit organizations with a national scope to maintain reserves of two to two and one-half times average revenues.

THEREFORE, it will be the policy of the Surface Navy Association to maintain one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in reserves at the end of each fiscal year to be invested in a combination of certificates of deposit, conservative mutual funds or other, similar, conservative instruments as has been the practice since 1999. Exemptions to this policy will require the recommendation of the Finance Committee and the Executive Committee (by majority vote in each case) and approval of the Board of Directors.








Enlisted Professional Education Grant Program (New Program in 2017-2018)

Background

- Many middle rank petty officers do not fit into the Navy education system.
- The cause is timing, career progression, deployment schedule or simply qualifications.
- These sailors could achieve greater professional skills or technical knowledge by attending certificate or other certified professional schools outside the Navy system if financial assistance was available.
- Navy Education Assistance Program acknowledges that reality but frequently only funds up to a maximum of 90% of course costs. (some cases only 70%)
- NEAP does not cover Lab Fees, Books or Miscellaneous costs that often price the sailor out of the opportunity to increase his or her professional proficiency.

Bottom Line

- Multiple certificate courses are available at Local Community Colleges or certified educational facilities that would increase technical capability.
- However support costs put these courses out of financial reach for many.



Enlisted Professional Education Grant Program

SNA Program

- Provide financial grants to qualified Enlisted Surface Warfare and Cuttermen members of SNA to assist in fulfilling professional goals and qualifications.
- Support is IAW SNA charter to provide support for the professional development and training of active duty members of the Surface Navy and Coast Guard.
- Stimulate interest in joining SNA as a Professional Organization furthering career.




