

Committee Highlights

- Monitored chapter progress in meeting new Chapter Excellence Award program qualifying, objective, and subjective scoring criteria implemented this year
 - ✓ Reviewed, discussed, and approved twelve 2018 chapter awards
 - ✓ Modified chapter excellence award grading criteria based upon first year's experience – adjusted Medium Chapter membership size upwards, provided clarifying information for various grading criteria/categories, and added ability to receive credit for social media posts.
- Worked with SNA staff to develop web-based Enlisted Personnel Survey soliciting feedback from survey respondents regarding their knowledge, perceptions, and thoughts on way SNA could better support our enlisted shipmates.
 - ✓ Ten-fifteen minute survey; can be taken either on SNA website or on your smartphone

Topline Assessment

- Steady, solid numbers in all categories, similar to last year
 - ✓ Total membership level reached level last seen in 2008.
 - ✓ Averages over 10 years remains: 80% paid, 20% promotional (+/- 4%)
 - Enlisted membership remains low with numbers buoyed by Cutterman merger
 - Charleston chapter 2017 new members did not renew in 2018 ... their chapter showed a net loss of 60 members this year.
- SNA/Cutterman Association merger continues to show benefits

- ✓ Douglas Munro (Anacostia) Chapter added 23 members, first USCG Chapter to achieve SNA Chapter Excellence award status



Officer Membership

- □ Both paid and promotional numbers continue to improve from 2013/14 low points, with both categories gaining more ground over time.
- □Officer paid and promotional memberships account for 44% of total membership numbers at EOY18, as compared with other paid (39%), enlisted (4%), and corporate (13%) numbers. (Same as last year)
- □This speaks to the health of our membership when taking into account both our active duty and retired surface warrior officer population (the latter included in the "other" membership category).
- □540 of our active duty officers are also life members (net gain of 21 in 2018).








Enlisted Membership

Remains a challenge

- Increased numbers in 2017 include Charleston initiative to provide 59 paid one year memberships to enlisted personnel attending chapter events at NPTU CHASN; we did not see these renew in 2018.
- ESWS CPO promotional memberships not a driver but we still believe they are worth offering.
- □ Notable Enlisted personnel support, particularly by Chapter Excellence Award Winners:
 - · Established Chapter Senior Enlisted Leadership Positions
 - Promote membership at senior enlisted leadership courses, including CPO heritage week, senior enlisted waterfront leadership courses


Initial Survey Sample Results

- 35 Participants -

- 62% E7-E9, 82% ESWS gualified, 50% are SNA members
- 70% indicated they had never attended an SNA Chapter event
 - including 10 of 19 members/former members
- 79% agree/strongly agree that membership in an association is important for networking
- 53% disagree/strongly disagree they have access to SITREP at their command
- 9% agree, 73% are neutral on SITREP and SNA website content being useful to their career
- 12% agree/strongly agree they have considered or applied for a scholarship or enlisted grant
- 70% agree/strongly agree, 21% neutral that SNA membership fees are reasonable
- 59% agree/strongly agree, 20% neutral they would upload a free SNA app onto their smartphone
- Significant event interest/participation: speaker luncheons, volunteer projects, holiday events, leadership/management forums, post-navy transition
- Out of 34 respondents, the highest number of individuals indicating they had joined or participated in other associations were 2 members of the Association of the United States Navy (AUSN) and 1 member/1 participant with the U.S. Naval Institute

 - · Objective: Professional development events, community service, awards programs, etc.
 - Subjective: Have an active chapter recruiting/retention program? Encouraging enlisted membership and participation at the chapter level? Other noteworthy activities or chapter events? Leadership succession plan?
- Qualifying criteria and objective/subjective scoring criteria initially developed by SNA staff, membership committee provided inputs/edits, and draft scoring sheets passed to chapters for review and comment.
 - New program briefed to and approved by EXCOM in fall 2017; implemented in 2018
 - Positive feedback from chapters prior to and throughout this calendar year
 - Briefed at 2017 SNA Chapter President Breakfast prior to rollout; will cover again this year.

Enlisted Professional Education Grant Program (New Program in 2017-2018)

Background

- Many middle rank petty officers do not fit into the Navy education system.
- The cause is timing, career progression, deployment schedule or simply qualifications.
- These sailors could achieve greater professional skills or technical knowledge by attending certificate or other certified professional schools outside the Navy system if financial assistance was available.
- Navy Education Assistance Program acknowledges that reality but frequently only funds up to a maximum of 90% of course costs. (some cases only 70%)
- NEAP does not cover Lab Fees, Books or Miscellaneous costs that often price the sailor out of the opportunity to increase his or her professional proficiency.

Bottom Line

- Multiple certificate courses are available at Local Community Colleges or certified educational facilities that would increase technical capability.
- However support costs put these courses out of financial reach for many.



Enlisted Professional Education Grant Program

SNA Program

- Provide financial grants to qualified Enlisted Surface Warfare and Cuttermen members of SNA to assist in fulfilling professional goals and qualifications.
